PASTOR'S PAGE

Dear Friends,

St. Peter writes, "Welcome to the living Stone, the source of life. The workmen took one look and threw it out; God set it in the place of honor. Present yourselves as building stones for the construction of a sanctuary vibrant with life, in which you'll serve as holy priests offering Christ-approved lives up to God." Building Stones. What a great image for Bethel, a church built with the stones gathered from our local fields. But the kind of stones Peter is referring to aren't field stone but living stone, what's on the *inside* of Bethel's sanctuary: *you*, the members of Bethel Church, who each in his or her own way is a living stone serving The Living Stone, the source of life, Jesus Christ.

This is never more true or more relevant than during the season of Lent. Starting March 12th and for the following four Wednesdays after that, we'll journey through the Lenten season together by hearing from individual living stones within our congregation. Each Wednesday evening, after we enjoy a potluck supper together, we'll listen to stories from individual members who'll talk about their life, their faith, and their relationship with God and the church; to be followed by open-forum discussion. Most of the living stones in attendance will be your neighbors and friends, others you may not know as well – that's one of the fringe benefits of these evenings – getting to know each other in the context of Christ centered conversation. Mark your calendars to make Wednesday evenings this Lent a not-to-be-missed time for fellowship and personal spiritual enrichment.

But not to get ahead of ourselves, Lent actually begins on March 5th (Ash Wednesday) with an inspirational service of worship among the Manchester area churches. This year the service will be held at Emanuel United Church of Christ in Manchester. I will have the honor of preaching again this year. My text comes from the Old Testament prophet, Joel (Joel 2:1-17). We'll consider what it means to live "between the vestibule and the altar" – a place that in Joel's day was occupied only by the priests. I'll make the argument that you and I occupy this very place ourselves, especially during the forty-days that we call Lent. During the service we'll all get up and move sacramentally from condemnation to grace, from death to life, as we receive first the imposition of ashes and then the bread and cup of Holy Communion. I'm confident this worship experience will be a memorable and meaningful beginning to the most sacred season of our Christian calendar. I look forward to being with you March 5, 12, 19, 26; April 2 and 9!

Coordinated by Bonnie Mitchell, the program directed our attention to persons in the world for whom a blanket (it still only costs \$5.00) offers comfort when they have lost everything and for whom other assistance like water, shelter, training and tools, can be given through generous gifts to the Blankets+ offering. MATERIAL AIDS

The dedication of Material Aids takes place on Sunday, March 2. We will be sending School & Health Kits to Church World Service; eyeglasses to World Medical Relief; quilts to Mott Children's Hospital and the VA; stamps to Stamps for a Living; pop can tabs to Ronald McDonald House; Little Dresses for Africa to Africa and Box Tops for Education to local schools. A report of all these gifts will be in the April newsletter.

We gather all these items year round. If you find a good deal on school or health kit items, pick them up and bring them to church. If you find a good deal on material for quilts, buy it (check with the Quilters on type of material needed). Continue to save pop can tabs, stamps (leave a ¼ inch around them), box tops, soup labels, etc.

Also bring your paper and plastic grocery bags to church and leave them at the back of the church or near the coat rack by the Fellowship Hall. These are used every month for the Manchester Family Service food distribution day. Ask for paper bags when you go grocery shopping. **Thank you!**

And if you have medical equipment that you no longer use check with Cathy Moore. The World Medical Relief organization may be able to use it.

Amish widow Emma Yoder's first quilt class brings the most unlikely people together. There's Star, a young woman yearning for stability; Pam and Stuart Johnston, a struggling couple at odds in their marriage; Paul Ramirez, a young widower hoping to find solace in finishing a quilt; Jan Sweet, a rough and tough biker doing some creative community service; and Ruby Lee Williams, a preacher's wife looking for relaxation when parish problems mount. But as these beginning quilters learn to transform scraps of material into beauty; their fragmented lives begin to take new shape with the helping hands of each other and the healing hand of God.

Join the club of unlikely quilters who show up for Amish widow Emma Yoder's quilting classes. A troubled young woman, a struggling couple, a widower, a rough and tough biker, and a preacher's wife make up the mismatched lot. But as their problems begin to bind them together like the scraps of fabric stitched together in a quilt, they learn to open up and lend a helping hand. Is this what God had in mind to heal hurting hearts and create beauty from fragments?


