

# PASTOR'S PAGE

#### Dear Friends,

Have you been called? No, I'm not asking if your cell phone has a message waiting. I'm asking if you've been called in the spiritual / theological sense of the word. It may seem an unlikely question for our February newsletter, but I believe it's a question deserving of our attention as we make our way into this New Year, 2014.

We get a sense of what it means to be called from the gospel of Matthew (Matthew 4:18-20). Here we find Jesus, walking along the shore of the Sea of Galilee when he sees two brothers, Simon and Andrew, doing what they do for a living – fishing. "Follow me," Jesus tells them, "and I will make you fishers of people." Then, we are told, they dropped their nets and followed him.

In ministerial circles, clergy will often ask one another to tell their "call-story". Over time these stories become well-rehearsed. We frame our answer in the context of our lives. We speak of our childhood, our family life, our education, and our experiences in church and in the workplace. Eventually, our sense of "call" becomes self-evident. We discover that the variety of circumstances and relationships throughout our lives has surrounded us with the grace and love of God. God has, for lack of a better term, lured us into God's service. And we, for lack of a better term, have taken the bait.

But don't think you have to be a first-century disciple or an ordained minister to be called. Whether you're aware of it or not, you *are* called, lured into relationship with God. It's easy to miss because God's not calling you to be something that you're not; he's calling you to be something that you are. God is asking you simply to say and do that which you were created to say and do. Your occupation may be a farmer, or an accountant, or a homemaker. Jesus is saying, "Follow me". Follow me, and I will make you farmers of people, accountants or people, homemakers of people. God in Jesus Christ will take the very things you take for granted – your skills, activities, and relationships – and he will put them to use for God's greater glory. God will use you (yes, you!) to glorify God's holy name, to bring God's grace and mercy to bear upon this world, one person, one relationship, at a time.

But here's the catch (excuse the pun). In order to answer God's call, you and I have to be willing to drop our nets. We have to set aside that which occupies and consumes us and let God take control. We have to let God guide the tractor we drive, the tax return we prepare, the lunchboxes we pack. We have to let God be the primary and consuming influence that motivates and directs everything we say and do – not only in our homes, schools, and places of work – but here at Bethel Church as well.

This February, my prayer for you, my prayer for me, and my prayer for our church is that we heed the call; that we live into the grace, peace, and mercy of a God who wants nothing more than to teach us how to fish.

# ADULT CHRISTIAN EDUCATION OPPORTUNITY

Money and stewardship are not only hot button topics in church, they provoke spiritual questions. Jesus said you cannot serve both God and money. But could better money management lead to better means for God's service? To this end, the Board of Christian Education would like to offer a nine-week course on financial management. The course is called, Financial Peace. It is taught through a series of DVD's produced by economic advisor, Dave Ramsey. Ramsey asks, "What could the people of God do for the kingdom of God if they were debt-free?" According to his website, class participants, on average, pay off \$5,300 in debt, save \$2,700, and increase their church giving by 30%. # **MATERIAL AIDS**

February is our month to gather in the School Kits and Health Kits that we send to Church World Service (CWS). CWS distributes these kits all over the world where ever there is a need. To assemble either of these kits see the specifics below:

#### School Kit

- One pair of blunt metal scissors (rounded tip)
- Three 70-count spiral notebooks or notebooks totaling 200-210 pages (no loose-leaf or filler paper)
- One 30-centimeter ruler (12")
- One hand-held pencil sharpener
- One large eraser
- Six new pencils with erasers
- One box of 24 crayons (only 24)
- One 12"x14" to 14"x17" finished cotton or lightweight canvas bag with cloth handles (This bag is provided by Jean Martin; pick one up at church to fill with all of the items)

#### Health Kit

- One hand towel measuring approximately 16"x28" (no fingertip or bath towels)
- One washcloth
- One wide-tooth comb
- One nail clipper
- One bar of soap (bath size in wrapper)
- One toothbrush (in original packaging)
- Six standard size Band-Aids

Place all items in a one-gallon plastic bag with a zipper closure. Please do not add toothpaste to the kit. CWS will add toothpaste to shipments of kits just prior to shipping.

The value of a School Kit is \$15 and a Health Kit is \$10. If you don't have time to assemble a kit consider donating the money towards purchasing a kit. See Cathy Moore to donate.

CWS also needs help with the processing/shipping costs, which are \$2.00 per kit. Consider donating money towards this cost.

Remember to continue to save: Campbell soup labels, Box Top labels, pop can tabs, no longer needed eyeglasses, lenses, hearing aids, cell phones, and cancelled postage stamps (leave at least a ¼ inch around the stamp PLEASE). We also are collecting the fronts of greeting cards to send to St. Judes for their recycled card program.

Also bring your paper and plastic grocery bags to church and leave them at the back of the sanctuary or near the coat rack by the Reineck Fellowship Hall. These are used every month for the Manchester Family Service food distribution day. Ask for paper bags when you go grocery shopping. **Thank you!** 

And if you have medical equipment that you no longer use check with Cathy Moore. The World Medical Relief organization may be able to use it.

- 6. If you are unable to greet when you are scheduled, please find a substitute if possible. Then notify the church office (429-8530) or Joe Moore (428-8687). Do this by Monday of the week you greet so the correct information can be listed in the worship bulletin.
- 7. Continue to greet until the service begins.
- 8. Please leave your name tag on the back pew or table.

#### **USHERS' RESPONSIBILITIES**

Thank you for being part of one of our ushering teams. Besides serving in a most practical way, you are very much involved in outreach and evangelism. As members and visitors enter church, ushers are generally the first to welcome them after the greeters do. Take advantage of this golden opportunity to create a friendly atmosphere where they feel at home and where the mood is established that prepares them for worship.

#### YOUR SPECIFIC RESPONSIBILITIES ARE:

- 1. Arrive at church thirty minutes before the service. Dress appropriately to make a good impression on members and visitors. Your name tag will be on the back table.
- 2. Turn on lights, open windows and set up fans (summer) and turn up heat in entryway (winter). Place some bulletins in the balcony entrance at the top of the stairs and in the annex.
- 3. Reserve rows for choirs or other groups as needed. Check with minister and choir director before the service.
- 4. As worshipers arrive, usher them to the pew of their choice. Encourage members to sit near the front if they are willing and to sit as close together as possible. Give them a bulletin.
- 5. Families with young children and infants can be reminded that the Sunday School for 3 & 4 year olds and a child care room for infants through 2-year olds are both available during the worship hour.
- 6. If you think someone is a visitor, ask them to sign the guest book. Try and seat visitors with a church member in the main sanctuary. If that is not possible, please escort them to the balcony or annex. Don't seat them alone in a pew if possible.
- 7. Seat latecomers during a hymn or announcement time. Avoid seating during a prayer, anthem or scripture reading.
- 8. Help to take the offering. Collect offering by starting a plate down a row and recovering another plate as it comes toward you down an adjacent row. Continue in this way. Remember to collect in the balcony and annex. Do not collect from choirs.
- 9. If your name is the first one listed on your team, you are the HEAD USHER. Please remind your team the week they should usher. You should take attendance during the service and enter the numbers on the sheet provided. Include those in choir, three, four and five year old Sunday School classes and child care (nursery).
- 10. Be prepared to deal with emergencies. Know the location of fire extinguishers, first aid kits and telephone for dialing 911.
- 11. Following the service:
  - a. Collect bulletins and other papers left behind and leave them on the back pew for recycling.
  - b. Straighten hymnals. Turn down heat in entryway to 50 degrees. Leave your name tag on the back pew or table.
  - c. Pick up debris and articles for lost and found (church office).
- 12. If you cannot usher when you are scheduled, please arrange for a substitute if possible. Then notify the HEAD USHER and church office (429-8530 or Joe Moore (428-8687). Do this by Monday of the week you usher so the correct information can be listed in the worship bulletin.
