

PASTOR'S PAGE

Dear Friends,

Show of hands. What would you rather listen to, a good lecture or a good story? I thought so. As much as a lecture can convey much needed information, what usually sticks with us is story.

So God, in God's wisdom, chose to make himself known to us through story. God inspired human hearts and minds to write this story, not just the good and grand parts, but the sad and remorseful parts as well. We call it the Holy Bible. From the creation accounts of Genesis to the provocative prophesies of Revelation, we hear story upon sacred story telling the awesome wonder of God in relationship with folks just like you and me. How we come to know and trust these stories is the basis of our faith.

Which raises an important point. Christian faith and witness is not a spiritual journey of selfenlightenment. Christian faith and witness is a spiritual journey grounded in the teachings, in the stories, of Holy Scripture. We find *evidence* of God in the nature that surrounds us; the people we know, the places we frequent – true enough. But we don't come to *know* God that way. God is not a flower in bloom or an ocean wave crashing the surf; God is not a parent, teacher, or pastor; God is not mystical experience or unexplained coincidence. God is more, so much more, than any of this. Hence the essential grace and beauty of Holy Scripture.

To help us better comprehend this grace and beauty, we're going to begin this fall using a series of selected scriptural readings called the Narrative Lectionary. In recent years we've followed prescribed readings from the Revised Common Lectionary (RCL). For all its advantages, the RCL approaches the Bible in a fractured way, pulling bits and pieces from the whole of scripture, then relying on the listener to reassemble the parts. By contrast, the Narrative Lectionary approaches the Bible sequentially, from beginning to end. In September, we'll start reading from the book of Genesis and continue working our way through passages in the Old Testament. At Christmas time, we'll transition into the gospel of Matthew and continue throughout the winter to study Matthew in its entirety. Then in the spring, we'll move on to the teachings of the early church, the book of Acts and the writings of the Apostle Paul.

My hope in following the Narrative Lectionary is that we'll all gain a better understanding of Holy Scripture and the God revealed in its pages. To help worship relate to teaching and our teaching relate to worship, Sunday School will use a curriculum (Living the Word) that also follows the Narrative Lectionary from week to week. Living the Word will employ a dedicated classroom for all age groups, replacing the rotational style teaching previously used for grades K through 4. This curriculum also offers lessons for our preschoolers, who'll meet now during Sunday School rather than during worship.

Come and experience a new flavor of preaching and teaching at Bethel Church this fall. See you in September!

RE-MEMBERING

This is the first installment in a monthly series written by members of our mission team about their personal experiences on the Pine Ridge Indian Reservation (July 2014)

Jen Bucholtz writes:

"Having grown up in an area of Oklahoma steeped in Indian culture, I felt prepared for the paradox of poverty, hopelessness, pride, spirituality, and beauty that defines life on the Rez. What I was not prepared to experience was the anger and anguish that emanates from speakers whose culture and personhood has been attacked relentlessly by ignorance, legislation, and even military action. As a Christian, a follower of a Christ who stood for the invisible people of His time, I was deeply moved not just by the injustices of the past, but also the ongoing violation of the land and rights of these indigenous people. I was repeatedly struck by the inescapable fact that there is no fix for the plight of the Lakota We can't correct the Nation. countless wrongs any more than we can unspill the oil of the

Valdez or unsink the Titanic. And yet the trip was uplifting; I credit my prayer partner for this. The daily prayer packages I received helped me to see past the ugly truth of my role as a privileged white person in nearly obliterating a way of life, and instead see the similarities between 'them' and 'us'. Having a person at home lifting my name in prayer and gently pointing to the kind of love that cannot be destroyed was essential to my positive experience at Pine Ridge. The daily prayers reminded me that we aren't traveling to South Dakota in isolation but rather in communion with each other. Each evening, our group of thirteen met to open a letter, a small gift, or some other token of prayer from our prayer partners. Sometimes we shared a thought that was especially meaningful. Often, we just savored privately the gift of prayer that we had received. In a community where suicide, poverty, hate, and disease are a reality of daily life, prayer is more valuable than any monetary offering we could possibly make and has more power to change hearts and perhaps even circumstances. To my prayer partner and to all those who have been or will be prayer partners in the future, I say *Pilamaya ye* (Lakotan for 'thank you')."

MATERIAL AIDS

Remember to continue to save the following items all year round: Campbell soup labels, Box Top labels, pop can tabs, no longer used eyeglasses, lenses, hearing aids, cell phones, and cancelled postage stamps (leave at least a ¼ inch around the stamp).

Also bring your paper and plastic grocery bags to church and leave them at the back of the church or near the coat rack by the Fellowship Hall. These are used every month for the Manchester Family Service food distribution day.

P.S. Keep a lookout for school and health kit supply items on sale this summer. And bring them to church. We collect these items year round.

SUNDAY SCHOOL 2014 - 2015

Pastor Bucholtz will introduce and explain this new information at our Sunday School Kick-Off on September 7, 2014 in the Reineck Fellowship Hall immediately following worship. Following his presentation, parents will have an opportunity to meet briefly with their child(ren)'s Sunday School teacher(s) and our students will be invited downstairs to learn about church safety protocols including what to do in the event of a fire, tornado, etc.

We will allot some time during our Kickoff meeting on the 7th for paperwork to be completed. Emergency contact forms must be on file prior to our first Sunday School session on September 14, 2014.
