#### TIME WITH CHILDREN

2 Kings 24:18–25:21 (selected verses) (Pg. 313, Pew Bible) FIRST LESSON Zedekiah was twenty-one years old when he began to reign; he reigned eleven years in Jerusalem. He did what was evil in the sight of the Lord, just as Jehoiakim had done. Indeed, Jerusalem and Judah so angered the Lord that he expelled them from his presence. Zedekiah rebelled against the king of Babylon. And in the ninth year of his reign, in the tenth month, on the tenth day of the month, King Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon came with all his army against Jerusalem, and laid siege to it; they built siege works against it all around. So the city was besieged until the eleventh year of King Zedekiah. On the ninth day of the fourth month the famine became so severe in the city that there was no food for the people of the land. Then a breach was made in the city wall; the king with all the soldiers fled by night by the way of the gate between the two walls, by the king's garden, though the Chaldeans were all around the city. But the army of the Chaldeans pursued the king, and overtook him in the plains of Jericho; all his army was scattered, deserting him. Then they captured the king and brought him up to the king of Babylon at Riblah, who passed sentence on him. Then they bound him in fetters and took him to Babylon. Then the captain of the guard carried into exile the rest of the people who were left in the city and the deserters who had defected to the king of Babylon - all the rest of the population. The bronze pillars that were in the house of the Lord, as well as the stands and the bronze sea that were in the house of the Lord, the

Chaldeans broke in pieces, and carried the bronze to Babylon. What was made of gold the captain of the guard took away for the gold, and what was made of silver, for the silver. So Judah went into exile out of its land.
